## Illinois Forestry Development Council, Shawnee Resource Conservation and Development Area, and Partners Accelerate Forest Management through Technology

The Illinois Forestry Development Council (IFDC) recently awarded the Shawnee Resource Conservation and Development Area (SRCD) and their partners, the Forest Restoration Support Team (FRST) and Southern Illinois Prescribed Burn Association (SIPBA), funding to execute technological updates for communicating the importance of forest management to private landowners, volunteers, and the public across southern Illinois and beyond.
